# Special manuscript handling

Special manuscripts are publications which are not covered by the manuscript types of a journal. Besides the standard paper types (e.g. research article, review article, or technical note), the manuscript types also include communications (e.g. ANGEO communicates) or opinion papers (e.g. HESS) which are treated like any other standard paper type. But manuscripts outside of the MS types require a special handling which is described in the next sections:

### Editorial note – Paper level

An editorial note can be written either by the chief editors or by the handling editor of a paper. An editorial note is always **connected to an individual published paper**. It is used to provide the editor's perspective which readers should access before they access the paper itself. It is used for fraud papers and for retracted papers (both formally withdrawn), and also for papers where editors want to comment outside of the interactive discussion (IJ only) and outside of the classical commentaries and replies which are MS types and published as normal articles.

### Handling

- **Editors** send the manuscript of their editorial note as LaTeX or Word file to editorial@copernicus.org.
- The paper only receives typesetting.
- The paper is published as full-text PDF without subsequent pagination. A DOI is registered. The DOI follows the DOI of the corresponding paper: 10.5194/acp-5-1234-2015-editorial\_note.
- The paper does not receive an article HTML page (with full-text HTML) and no XML.
- The paper is published alongside an article.
- In case of fraud or retracted papers, the editorial note will not only be listed below the PDF/XML download icons of the corresponding paper but the reader will also be alerted once s/he opens the PDF of the corresponding paper. In addition, a note is set at the end of the abstract.
- The publication of an editorial note is **free of charges**.

# Corrigenda – Paper level

A corrigendum is written by the authors of a paper and the **corrigendum is always connected to this paper**. A corrigendum becomes necessary either because the authors made a mistake or because Copernicus made a mistake.

Handling

- **Authors** send the manuscript of their corrigendum as LaTeX or Word file to editorial@copernicus.org. Copernicus' Editorial Support then contacts the handling editor asking for approval.
- The paper receives image processing, typesetting, and copy-editing.
- The paper is published as full-text PDF without subsequent pagination. A DOI is registered. The DOI follows the DOI of the corresponding paper: 10.5194/acp-5-1234-2015-corrigendum.
- The paper does not receive an article HTML page (with full-text HTML) and no XML.
- The paper is published as supplement to an article.
- The publication of a corrigendum is free of charges in case Copernicus made the mistake. In case the **authors** caused the corrigendum, the costs are covered by the authors following the **reduced fees of 2/3** of the full APCs of category 1.

### Editorial – Volume/issue level

An editorial is written by the chief editors of the journal and is **connected to the journal itself or to a specific volume/issue** but not to an individual paper. An editorial contains fundamental statements or information to the journal, its policy, its strategy, or to basic guidelines like data or software code publication and citation.

#### Handling

- Normally without peer review
- **Chief editors** send the manuscript of their editorial as LaTeX or Word file to editorial@copernicus.org.
- Option 1: publication as full article
  - The paper receives image processing, typesetting, and copyediting.
  - $_{\odot}$   $\,$  The paper is published as full-text XML, HTML, and PDF.
  - The paper is subsequently paginated and appears in the issue TOC (if applicable).
  - The costs are covered by the **free pages budget** of the journal.
  - If the free pages budget cannot cover the costs, the first five pages are free of charges. Exceeding pages have to be covered by the authors of the editorial following the reduced fees of 2/3 of the full APCs for category 1.
- Option 2: publication as supplement
  - The paper only receives typesetting.
  - The paper is published as full-text PDF without subsequent pagination. A DOI is registered.

- The paper does not receive an article HTML page (with full-text HTML) and no XML.
- The paper is published alongside a volume or an issue. The position is above all other papers in that TOC and the **link name can be defined individually**.
- The costs are covered by the **free pages budget** of the journal.
- If the free pages budget cannot cover the costs, the first five pages are free of charges. Exceeding pages have to be covered by the authors of the editorial following the reduced fees of 1/3 of the full APCs for category 1.

## Preface/postface/introductory – Volume/issue/SI level

Prefaces/postfaces/introductory papers are written by editors or guest editors and belong normally to **special issues**, in rare cases also to volumes/issues. The work flow offers three options that can be chosen by chief editors. Thereby, chief editors decide about the services applied, about the bibliographic appearances of the paper, and whether the costs are covered by the free pages budget or by the authors of the paper.

### Handling

 Authors (most often guest editors) send their manuscript as LaTeX or Word file to editorial@copernicus.org. Copernicus' Editorial Support then contacts the chief editors asking for approval and for a decision regarding the three following options:

### • Option 1: full peer review and publication as full article

- The paper receives peer review and after acceptance image processing, typesetting, and copy-editing.
- The paper is published as full-text XML, HTML, and PDF.
- The paper is subsequently paginated and appears in the regular issue TOC (if applicable).
- In addition, the paper is linked in the respective volume/issue/special issue and positioned above all other papers and the **link name can be defined individually**.
- If chief editors decide that the costs are covered by the authors, the fees following the normal pricing scheme for APCs (full APCs for categories 1–4).
- Option 2: publication as full article
  - The paper receives image processing, typesetting, and copyediting. No peer review is applied.
  - $_{\odot}$   $\,$  The paper is published as full-text XML, HTML, and PDF.
  - The paper is subsequently paginated and appears in the regular issue TOC (if applicable).

- In addition, the paper is linked in the respective volume/issue/special issue and positioned above all other papers and the **link name can be defined individually**.
- If chief editors decide that the costs are covered by the authors, the fees following the reduced fees of 2/3 of the full APCs for category 1.
- Option 3: publication as supplement
  - The paper only receives typesetting.
  - The paper is published as full-text PDF without subsequent pagination. A DOI is registered.
  - $\circ$   $\;$  The paper does not receive an article HTML page (with full-text HTML) and no XML.
  - The paper is published alongside a volume, an issue, or a special issue. The position is above all other papers in that TOC and the **link name can be defined**.
  - If **chief editors** decide that the costs are covered by the **authors**, the fees following the **reduced fees of 1/3** of the full APCs for category 1.

## Other types of non-article TOC objects

**Overview papers** are often used in the TOCs of special issues. Regarding peer review, production, and publication overview papers are treated like prefaces/postface/introductory papers. Overview papers are not an extra category. The only addition is that special issues can mark one article (regardless of being a full paper or just a supplement) as overview paper. Then, a link "Overview paper" appears below the title of the special issue and its editors, next to the link "More information" (if applicable).

**Book reviews** are either with or without peer review. If they are with peer review they are treated like normal papers. Often, they are even an extra MS type. If they do not receive peer review, they are handled like prefaces option 2. That means, they are fully produced and the authors cover the costs following reduced fees of 2/3 of the full APCs of category 1.

**Other types**: Copernicus offers also to publish lists of editorial boards to be uploaded as PDF file as well as complete downloads of all article PDFs of a volume within one PDF file. These objects are free of charges, they appear above all other papers of the respective TOC, and the link name can be defined.
